The FITEQ Executive Board entered 2021 with both optimism and excitement, inspired by the response of the global teqball family in the face of unimaginable challenges last year. Of course, we knew that hurdles lay ahead and that the COVID-19 pandemic was far from over, but your resilience and determination in 2020 filled us with the confidence to make this our best year to date.

As we continued to adapt to the new normal, our strategic priority for 2021 was clear and simple – we wanted to ensure athletes had regular opportunities to compete at a high level. The progress made in 2020 from an organisational perspective, notably the rapid rise in the number of National Federations, had laid the foundations for our success in this endeavour, enabling the regular delivery of competitions around the world.

In the absence of a World Championships in 2020, the FITEQ Executive Board was steadfast in its ambition to provide athletes with the chance to shine at the highest level this year, so long as it was safe to do so. We are therefore delighted that the end of 2021 will culminate in our flagship event, which we anticipate to be the biggest in our history, featuring five event categories for the first time. The World Championships give us the chance to come together and celebrate our shared passion. They also provide unrivalled entertainment to our millions of fans and motivation to aspirational young teqers in all corners of the globe.

Never a community to shy away from challenges, the progress we have made together this year is something we should all take pride in noting our global footprint now stands at 125 National Federations. Our online following has also surpassed 5 million, making teqball and para teqball one of the top 6 sports on social media. The role you are all playing to develop teqball and para teqball at both grassroots and elite levels, as well as in driving our digital engagement, is outstanding and we sincerely thank you for your efforts.

This year, we were delighted to officially launch para teqball. We have promoted our parasport since our journey began, but it took us several years to go through the necessary steps to get to the point where we could officially inaugurate para teqball under FITEQ. Sport at its core should be for everyone, regardless of age, ability or background. To stay true to this and live up to our ambition to be a sport for all, we must provide opportunities for all aspiring tegers to enjoy the world's fastest growing sport. In launching the official rules of para teqball, we are paving the way for hidden stars to emerge in elite level competitions. We have already seen how this is inspiring a new generation of tegers to reach their full potential.

Off the court, we have always looked to use the power of sport to have a lasting social impact. As the leaders of the teqball family, to us this means supporting the communities and environments that are most in need. This year, we continued to actively engage with leading international organisations and

developed and implemented our own initiatives to help contribute to a better and brighter world.

There are two projects that are of particular importance to us: the Table of Peace and our Sustainable Development Handbook. Starting with the latter, it is worth noting that teqball began it's a journey in an increasingly environmentally conscious world. This has been advantageous as we work towards our goal of being a sustainable sport in all aspects.

From the outset, we have looked to embrace sustainability principles in all of our day-to-day operations. We understand our responsibility to engage and assist all stakeholders with the integration of sustainability within their own organisations. Accordingly, we developed the Sustainable Development Handbook and published it in March this year. Since then, we have been greatly encouraged by your shared determination for teqball to make a difference. Thank you for your contributions and please keep up the good work!

Turning to the Table of Peace programme, we wanted to build on our collaboration with Peace and Sport to offer further hope and guidance to refugees and individuals from disadvantaged communities. Following the success of the joint project with Peace and Sport in the the Zaatari Refugee Camp in Jordan over the past few years, we launched our own global programme under the banner of Table of Peace.

This was launched in Djibouti in February 2021 with tables donated to three UNHCR refugee camps and "train the trainer" projects introduced to ensure a long-term legacy. Since then, we have worked hard to engage young people across the world in sporting activities to help give them an escape from the daily challenges they face, whilst also teaching them transferrable skills and key values such as teamwork, inclusivity and integrity. CSR and sustainability programmes will continue to be a key priority for us and we are always welcome to hearing how we can support your initiatives.

Looking ahead, our values of respect, integrity, passion, inclusion and ambition will keep guiding every decision we take. Next year, we have so much to look forward to. Our new competition structure is set to be announced, which will further professionalise our sport, whilst we will continue preparations for major multi-sport events, including the European Games 2023 where we will feature as a medal sport. Additionally, we will keep listening, learning and innovating to ensure our rapidly growing Federation remains at the cutting-edge of the future of sport.

We encourage all of you to read this report and learn about the amazing work that has been carried out all over the world this year. To our National Federations, our athletes, coaches, officials, volunteers, fans, and of course the incredible FITEQ staff, we thank you for your belief in our vision, the resilience you continue to show, and your creative spirit that drives us forward together.

Established in March 2017, the International Teqball Federation (FITEQ) is the governing body presiding over teqball and para teqball. The sport has enjoyed rapid growth over the last few years as a result of increasing athlete participation, a growing fanbase and the development of strategic partnerships. There are currently 125 National Federations in the FITEQ family, leading the growth of the sport in their respective countries.

WHAT WE DO

FITEQ drives the ambitions of teqball and para teqball. We believe that the sport can inspire people of any age, ability, gender or culture. Our dedicated team aims to offer youthful and innovative sporting activities with competitive spirit in mind. FITEQ seeks to continue to grow and develop teqball and para teqball globally by expanding its National Federation framework and its competition portfolio. FITEQ is primed for action and is looking forward to an exciting future built on great optimism, great ambitions and great partnerships. We are responsible for:

- Government and management of teqball and para teqball at the international level;
- Development and promotion of tegball and para tegball globally;
- The codification of the official rules and regulations of teqball and para tegball, as well as the para tegball classification;
- Supporting the establishment of National Federations;
- Education and development of athletes, coaches and technical officials;
- Sanctioning national and international competitions and events;
- Establishing and maintaining World Ranking statistics.

FITEQ has a vision of every person being able to participate in teqball and para teqball, and to allow all involved to reach their full potential, whatever level that might be, whilst inspiring the world through sporting success.

As I reflect on the accomplishments of 2021, I take pride and satisfaction in the continued growth in our results-based activities, despite the relatively unknown post-pandemic landscape for global sport.

As the Director of the management team, the role of Sport Director involves three (3) main areas of focus all of which are interconnected and interdependent, not only within the department itself but equally to the other areas in the Federation.

Firstly, on behalf of the General Secretary, it is the responsibility of the Sport Director to establish and communicate the strategic and operational priorities in an unambiguous, understandable, and measured manner. This narrative is drawn from the vision set by the Executive Board aligned to the approved budget and accompanying roadmap.

Secondly, the role involves overall team leadership, workforce management and ongoing organisational capacity building. In simple terms, the Sport Director should lead but likewise should support the sport team as required. This is to ensure all projects, programmes and plans align to the strategic objectives of the Executive Board measured against the key pillars of strong governance and management, exciting sporting ambitions, robust partnerships and industry leading communications and marketing.

Set against the above, the Sport Director then manages the various steps of internal review and approval, budget management, project supervision and delivery, and finally, detailed reporting and assessment.

Covering six (6) functional areas and nine (9) different languages, the sport department firmly sits at the heart of FITEQ and its continued global aim to promote the positive values of teqball and para teqball.



Throughout this year, we have continued to build our relations with leading sports organisations, who are playing a critical role in teqball and para teqball's global development. Since attaining full Global Association of International Sports Federations (GAISF) Membership in November 2020, we have worked closely with the GAISF and Alliance of Independent Recognised Members of Sport (AIMS) teams to ensure FITEQ's organisational framework is of the highest standard. We are grateful for their support and we were delighted when our General Secretary Marius Vizer Jr was elected onto the AIMS Council in November 2021, enabling FITEQ to give back to a community that continues to support our journey.

As always, athletes are the primary focus at FITEQ. Ultimately, this is what connects and measures FITEQ to our fans, host cities, event organisers, National Federations, local communities, and commercial partners. The athletes are our heroes and the heroes of our millions of fans around the world. In spite of the challenges the world of sport has faced this year, our National Federation framework, built from the best instruments of governance and sustainable modelling, has ensured athletes have been able to compete at a high level throughout the year and qualify to the pinnacle of our sport – the 2021 Teqball World Championships.

SPORT DEVELOPMENT

As of 1 December 2021, FITEQ has 125 National Federations covering all five continents.

From these National Federations, 65% are also either recognised by their National Olympic Committee (NOC) or National Sport Authority (NSA) – a further testament to our growing position of relevance within the international landscape.

FITEQ, through its sport department, has continued to deliver its National Federation Development programme around the world, whilst the introduction of the Teqball and Para teqball Roadshows enabled Federations to reignite their growth in the post-pandemic world.

The sport development team is led by Réka Reichard in conjunction with the executive leadership from the General Secretary on matters primarily involving NOC relations and sport diplomacy.

CLUB DEVELOPMENT

The club development team, co-led by Attila Tóth and Ádám Szabados, works in close harmony with the sport development team via the Sport Director.

The team has had another highly productive year, building on the success of the Club Development programme, which was established in April 2020

to support the teqball family during and after the pandemic, as well as to stimulate the long-term growth in mass participation at both grassroots and professional club levels.

The Teqball Roadshow added further stimulus to the investment in existing and new clubs that are benefitting from the Club Development programme. As a result of these support mechanisms, there are now over 3,000 teqball clubs across the five continents – a nearly 100% increase from the start of the year.

SPORT OPERATIONS

The sport operations team is hybrid functional area dealing on one side with competition management, sport policies and results / rankings, whilst on the other side focussing on sport department recruitment and onboarding, education, sport demonstrations, and communications, as well as other bespoke projects. The department went through a structural change in June, with the team merging under the leadership of Krisztina Csavajda.

A major success story this year was the addition of teqball as a medal sport at the European Games 2023. Remaining on the competition side, despite the ongoing challenges with the pandemic, FITEQ sanctioned over 140 events around the world, featuring nearly active 4,500 participants.

Education of the global teqball community remains a key priority for the team. The enhancement of the online education platform, in addition to the publication of 160 news articles to FITEQ website, as well as monthly and special newsletters, helped drive this forward.

EVENTS

As of 1 December, over 140 events have been organised in 2021, with the pinnacle of the calendar set to be held from 8-11 December when Poland welcomes the world for the 2021 Teqball World Championships.

The pandemic has continued to disrupt the global event calendar, but FITEQ and its National Federations have showed resilience and innovation to continue providing opportunities for athletes to compete at a high level.

FITEQ is in the process of finalising a new event portfolio for 2022 onwards, which has begun already with the European Teqball Tour events in Italy and Poland. The ambition of the new competition structure is to bring increased prize money and greater global interest to the sport's elite level events.

FITEQ also contributed to a number of events around the world, including the 2021 United Through Sports Virtual Youth Festival and the UEFA Euro 2020 Fan Zone project, to help introduce the sport to its growing global audience.

FITEQ - CSR AND DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS DEPARTMENT



FOREWORD

Throughout the pandemic, we have seen how the world is able to unite as one when our backs are against the wall. The intergovernmental and cross-industry collaboration to fight COVID-19, particularly to support those in disadvantaged or developing communities, is evidence that we are able to work together for a better world. Moreover, as we saw at COP26 in Glasgow in November, the world is increasingly ramping up its efforts to urgently act on climate change. At FITEQ, it has always been our goal to use our sport's global growth to make a positive and lasting impact on society. We are determined for our sport to not just be an end in itself, but also an effective way to help achieve larger



development goals. Our approach is based on clear evidence that sport-based programmes that are explicitly designed to address the needs of particular sections of the population have the potential to prevent disease, increase school attendance, improve learning levels, foster gender equity, enhance inclusion of persons with disability, and build skills that promote employment and economic development.

Following the impact of the pandemic on travel during 2020, we entered this year with a renewed sense of optimism and a new lease of energy as we looked to have a greater impact through our CSR and sustainability activities. Once again, we sought to keep ourselves accountable and to act as leaders for the global tegball family.

Educating and inspiring our stakeholders is at the core of our ambition, and it is therefore vital that we as FITEQ walk the walk and don't just talk the talk. With that in mind, we introduced a number of new programmes this year that have had a material impact around the world and equipped National Federations with the tools to make a meaningful difference themselves. Our global programmes have reached an estimated 15,000 people across three continents, and following a successful year back on the road we are ready for an even more impactful 2022.

WHAT HAPPENED IN 2021

Our activity in 2021 was driven by strengthening our cooperation with existing partners, including leading international organisations and our National Federations, and seeking to build new partnerships with organisations that share our ambition to contribute to a better and brighter world. Our focus has been predominantly in three key areas: diplomatic relations, sport for peace and development, and sustainability.

In terms of sustainability, we have continued to make considerable strides as both an organisation and a sport. As a Signatory to the UNFCCC Sports for Climate Action Framework and UN Race to Zero campaign, we have clearly signalled our ambition and to reach carbon neutrality as a sport. To support us on this journey, we published a <u>Sustainable Development Handbook</u> at the start of this year, which acts both a best practice guide and a practical tool to drive all teqball stakeholders forward in the collective effort to implement the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in all areas of the sport.

We regularly reviewed and updated our operational practices and policies throughout the year to ensure they always reflect our commitment to making a positive impact around the globe. It is critical that FITEQ acts as role model for all teqball stakeholders by applying sustainability principles and instilling an environmentally conscious culture in all of its day-to-day operations and events, and we take this responsibility very seriously. Starting from this year, FITEQ evaluated the sustainability of National Federations and provided guidance on how to improve, with a particular focus on the lowest scoring Federations. In terms of diplomatic relations, FITEQ's strategic partnership with the Ministry of Foreign and Trade of Hungary continued to support the engagement with governments around the world. In turn, this has enabled FITEQ to connect with cities, schools, universities, orphanages, as well as many other organisations, and promote the health and educational benefits of teqball and para teqball. More detailed information on these diplomatic visits is outlined below.

Turning to sport for peace and development, FITEQ's built on its efforts to support refugees from conflict areas, as well as individuals from disadvantaged communities. This originally began in the Zaatari Refugee Camp in Jordan, back in 2018. It was here that the organisation partnered with Peace and Sport to contribute to their Live Together programme. FITEQ developed a train the trainer initiative to ensure a long term legacy of young refugees being able to learn about and practice tegball to this day.

Following the success of the project in Jordan, FITEQ launched its own global programme under the banner of Table of Peace. This was launched in Djibouti in February 2021 with tables donated to three UNHCR refugee camps. The long-term strategy of Table of Peace is to engage young people in sporting activities to help give them an escape from the daily challenges they face, whilst also teaching them transferrable skills and key values such as teamwork, inclusivity and integrity.

In addition to donating tables, FITEQ is implementing the programme around the concept of training the trainers that has proven to be effective in the Zaatari Refugee Camp. After the launch in Djibouti, FITEQ has already implemented the programme across four different continents, despite the ongoing travel restrictions related to COVID-19. Additional information on the Table of Peace programme is included below.

FITEQ's National Federations are playing an increasingly active role in the sport's CSR and sustainability projects. In 2022 and beyond, FITEQ looks forward to further enhancing this collaboration and empowering all stakeholders in the global teqball family to play their part as we seek to continue making a meaningful contribution to a brighter future, in alignment with the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

CSR CASE STUDY - TABLE OF PEACE PROGRAMME, DJIBOUTI

FITEQ launched a new global CSR programme under the banner Table of Peace as part of its ongoing commitment to contribute to a brighter future through sport by using teqball to support communities all around the world.

#TABLEOFPEACE

The Table of Peace programme has seen FITEQ donate Teq tables to post-conflict and disadvantaged communities in collaboration with local partners. The aim of the programme is to engage young people in sporting activities to help provide an escape from the daily challenges they face, whilst also teaching them transferrable skills and key values such as teamwork, inclusivity and integrity. The initiative follows a successful long-standing partnership with Peace and Sport, where FITEQ has been part of the Live Together programme in the Zaatari Refugee Camp in Jordan.



The Table of Peace programme launched in February 2021, in Djibouti during the Teqball Roadshow, with FITEQ and the Djibouti Teqball Federation, in collaboration with the Djibouti National Olympic Committee and its President, IOC Member Aïcha Garad Ali, donating Teq tables to three UNHCR refugee camps in the country.



In addition to donating tables, FITEQ has implemented the programme around the concept of training the trainers that has proven to be effective in the Zaatari Refugee Camp as part of the Peace and Spot Live Together programme. FITEQ's team of sport instructors have provided practical workshops to trainers in the refugee camps and communities around the world, which is contributing to a lasting legacy of the teqball family continuing to grow and inspiring future generations.



FITEQ is thrilled to have launched the Table of Peace programme this year, as the team had been planning this programme for many months during the lockdown months across the world.

To see the implementation phase begin this year has been very special. Using teqball to make a real difference in communities that need it the most is something that FITEQ feels very strongly about. We want to use our platform to reach people that are facing adversity and use sport to teach them skills and life lessons that will help them in the future. This is only the start and we're excited about what the future holds.

TEQBALL YANGTZE - EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMME



In cooperation with the Education Bureau of Putuo District in Shanghai, FITEQ launched an educational programme in 10 schools in China. This was the start of an exciting journey and since the launch more and more schools have expressed an interest in joining the programme in the future.

The schools that purchased Teq tables were given an extra table by FITEQ, as well as sports equipment such as balls and jerseys. FITEQ provided educational materials and trained two teachers in every school to prepare them for the responsibility of leading sessions in their respective school, as well as organising competitions.

The goal of the programme is to establish a solid first generation of Teqers that is able to represent their school, club or even their country in future Teqball Competitions. FITEQ is in regular contact with the schools, and holds online training courses for the coaches. The Shanghai project is evidence that the development of FITEQ's online education platform is helping reduce carbon emissions, by enabling training programmes to be held virtually.

Over the course of this year, there were 500 participants from the 10 schools.

We are a global community and together we can continue growing our global reach. To help us achieve this, we want you to share your Teq moments with us, and allow us to share them with the world.










FOLLOWERS GROWTH





Report of the statutory auditor on the limited statutory examination to the General Assembly of International Federation of Teqball, Lausanne

As statutory auditors, we have examined the accompanying financial statements of International Federation of Teqball which comprise the balance sheet, the income statement and the notes for the year ended December 31, 2020.

These financial statements are the responsibility of the Executive Board. Our responsibility is to perform a limited statutory examination on these financial statements. We confirm that we meet the licensing and independence requirements as stipulated by Swiss law.

We conducted our examination in accordance with the Swiss Standard on the Limited Statutory Examination. This standard requires that we plan and perform a limited statutory examination to identify material misstatements in the financial statements. A limited statutory examination consists primarily of inquiries of company personnel and analytical procedures as well as detailed tests of company documents as considered necessary in the circumstances. However, the testing of operational processes and the internal control system, as well as inquiries and further testing procedures to detect fraud or other legal violations, are not within the scope of this examination.

Based on our limited statutory examination, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the financial statements do not comply with Swiss law and the company's articles of incorporation.

Furthermore we draw your attention to the fact that International Federation of Teqball is over-indebted. Docler Investments Sarl in their capacity as 19,3% owner of Teqball Holding Sarl, who is financially supporting FITEQ confirm in a letter of support dated October 6th, 2021 that they are willing and capable of financing FITEQ activities and the necessary operating expenditures (through Teqball Holding Sarl) for at least over a one year period, if not covered by revenues.

1. Details of the principles applied in the annual accounts

Tangible fixed assets

5. Other informations required by law

The company is over-indebted, according to article 725 al. 2 CO. Remediation measures have been taken to get out of this situation. The federation is responsible for the debt and intends to repay this in the long run through the growth of sport related revenues (broadcasting, national federation fees, sponsorship revenue, membership revenue and licencing of events, etc).

Until such revenues are able to cover the debts and operating expenses of the federation, Docler Investments Sarl in their capacity as 19.3% owner of Teqball Holding Sarl, who is financially supporting FITEQ confirm in a letter of support dated October 6th, 2021 that they are willing and capable of financing activities and the necessary operating expenditures (through Teqball Holding Sarl) for at least over a one year period, if not covered by revenues.
