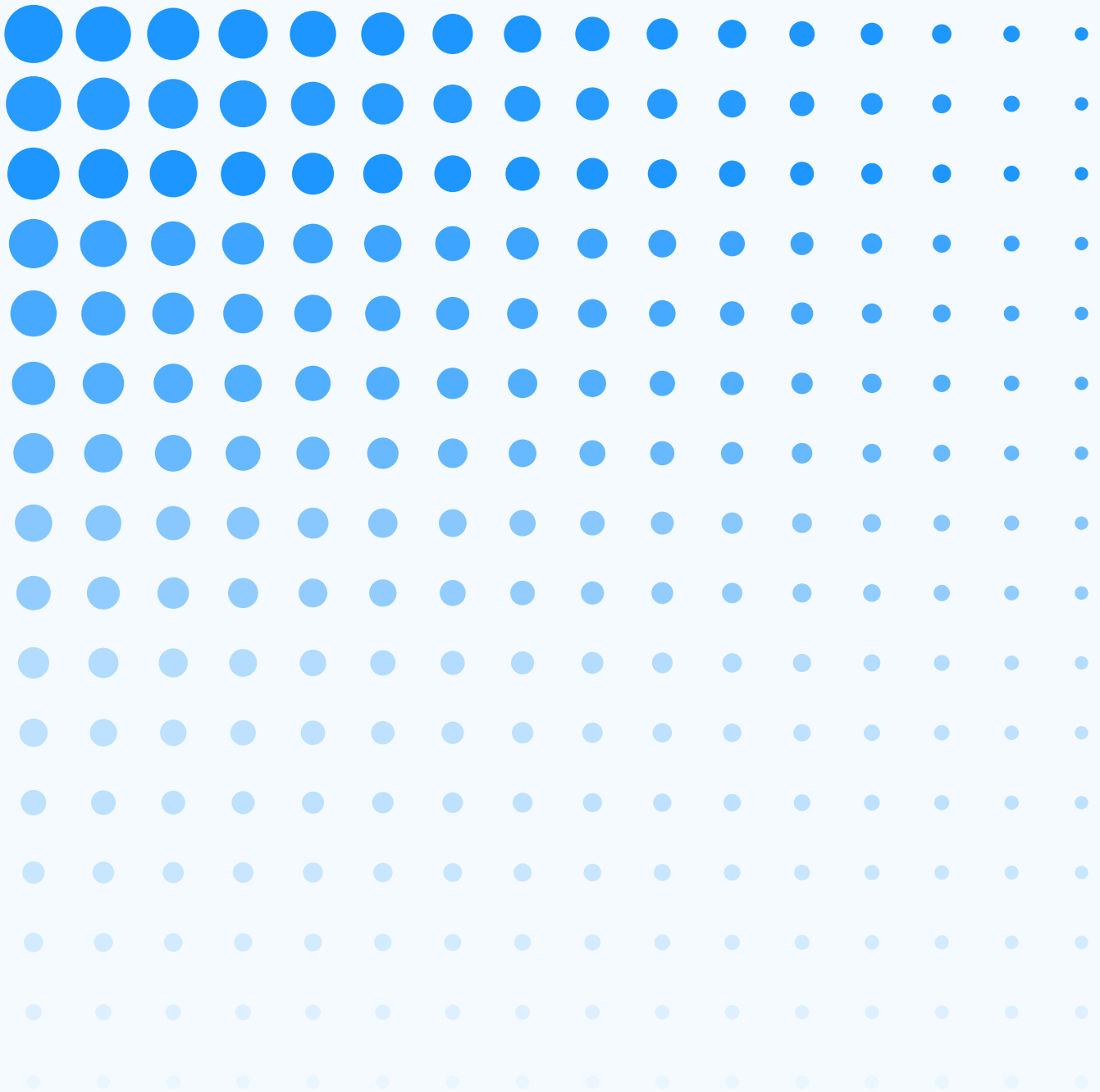
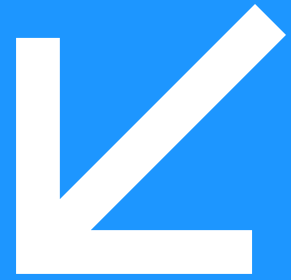
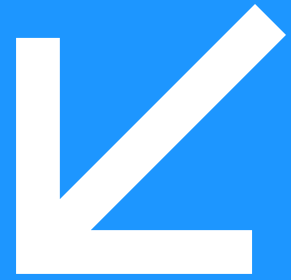

INTRODUCTION

Data pipelines are software development kits that extract raw data from one system then transform it into another format before storing it in another system for other teams or tools. 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COMPONENTS OF AN ELT DATA PIPELINE

ELT stands for "extract, load, and transform." These are the three primary functions that every data pipeline should be able to perform.

In practice, though, many pipelines will also include a fourth step of preparing or cleansing the data before loading it into its final destination.

The first step is extraction. This involves getting raw data from one source system and saving it somewhere accessible by other tools or teams. The second step is transformation, which takes this extracted information and reformats it so that different systems can read them correctly. A typical example of transformation would

be converting comma-separated values (CSV) files back into their original table structure to load them into a relational database management system like MySQL or PostgreSQL. Finally, after the data has been transformed, it can be loaded into its final destination. This is where the pipeline will store the information in a format that other tools or teams can then read and use to answer questions about your company's business goals.

Someone responsible for designing database architecture like MySQL, PostgreSQL, or NoSQL databases, such as MongoDB or Cassandra. The DBA will set up table structures indexes queries that allow you to get answers quickly while minimizing resource usage on their end.

Data Engineer

Data engineers are responsible for building out the pipelines themselves, but they don't have to possess expertise in all three of these areas. Data engineers are typically more focused on development and understanding business goals through software engineering best practices.



Data Architect

A data architect is someone responsible for creating the blueprints of your company's data architecture, which includes overall database design and how different systems will connect through APIs or flat files. They are also capable of setting up ELT processes.

Head of Data Analytics

The head of data analytics is in charge of data strategy for their company. This individual understands how to derive value from the raw data stored within your databases and can help other departments turn this into actionable insights through visualizations, dashboards, reports, and so on.
