And what about the special promise God made to King
David, that one of his family members would sit on the throne of
Israel forever? Now there was no throne of Israel!

God's promises confused the Israelites living in Babylon. They wondered if these promises would still come true and if they could still trust God.

God knew how confused they were. So, He sent His prophet **ISAIAH** to give them one of the most **IMPORTANT** messages in the whole Bible.





s our story **OVER**?" they asked Isaiah. "Is this the **END**?" "It isn't the end," Isaiah answered. "In fact, just wait until you hear what God is going to do next!"

Can you **IMAGINE** how excited the Israelites were to hear what Isaiah had to say?

First, Isaiah told them their time in Babylon wouldn't last forever. Seventy years, he said, and then they would be back in their own land. Then Isaiah told them about the MESSIAH.

Messiah means "anointed one." Samuel had anointed young David with oil as a sign that he was being **SET APART** by God for a very special job—to be king of all Israel!

And now Isaiah was saying that there was another "anointed one" coming. A baby would be born! He would be called **IMMANUEL**, which means "God with us" (but He would also have another name).

This baby would be from King David's family, and He would grow up to rule God's people **FOREVER**!
